Subject: **Expanded On-Street Parking Evaluation – Sixth Avenue between North Midland Avenue and North Broadway, Nyack, New York**

Dear Mr. Politi:

Based on recent discussions, we expanded the field investigation, evaluation and recommendations to address the continuing on-street parking concerns along Sixth Avenue, between North Broadway to the east and North Midland Avenue to the west. The concern is that residents park along both sides of this roadway and in many locations reduce the width and number of travel lanes to one for two-way traffic flow. While this is a concern for general traffic conditions, it is also a concern related to access for emergency vehicles and overall safety.

**Recommendations**

To enhance overall safety and maintain a reasonable level of traffic flow on this roadway, the Village should consider maintaining parking along both the north and south sides of Sixth Avenue from North Midland Avenue to the intersection of Francis Avenue. This would maintain a two-way travel lane width of 18 feet. It is recommended; however, NO PARKING HERE TO CORNER signs be installed on both the north side and south side of Sixth Avenue near the intersection with North Midland Avenue to open up the approach pavement area of Sixth Avenue at this intersection.

Similar NO PARKING HERE TO CORNER signs should be installed on both the north side and south side of Sixth Avenue at Westend Avenue and Francis Avenue.

For the section of Sixth Avenue from Francis Avenue to the west to North Broadway to the east, the Village should consider prohibiting parking on a daily basis along the northerly side of Sixth Avenue. Parking along the southerly side of Sixth Avenue can be maintained potentially with a restriction of no overnight parking from 3:00 A.M. to

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

6:00 A.M. on one night to facilitate street cleaning. On this particular overnight parking restriction parking should be permitted along the northerly side for the one overnight condition. If street cleaning is limited to Spring, Summer and Fall, it may be appropriate to install signing to indicate these restrictions. To accommodate the one night of overnight parking the existing pavement marking at intersections along the north side of 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue should remain in place.

In order to permit parking along the south side of Sixth Avenue for its entire length between Francis Avenue and North Broadway, the same type of parking prohibition should be maintained at each of the intersections with the existing pavement markings to accommodate maintaining appropriate sight lines for motorists exiting the side streets.

We are available to discuss these recommendations further at the appropriate time.
