BETWEEN 6:00pm ON THE EVENING BEFORE AND 7:00am ON THE DAY OF PICK UP.

TRASH CANS MUST NOT EXCEED OVER 50 LBS IN WEIGHT.

ONE PERSON SHOULD BE ABLE TO LIFT IT.

(1) THE FOLLOWING YARDWASTE MATERIALS MUST BE BAGGED:

GRASS, WEEDS, LEAVES.

(2) BRUSH: MUST BE IN MANAGEABLE TIED BUNDLES LESS THEN 5 FEET LONG.

(3) LEAVES: MUST BE BAGGED FROM DEC 5 - OCT 15

a. LEAVES: IN THE FALL, (OCT 15 - DEC 5) YOU MAY PLACE LEAVES IN THE
GUTTER FOR PICK UP.

b. THE LEAVES MUST BE FREE OF ROCKS, STICKS, BRUSH, AND TRASH.

(4) CARDBOARD: SHOULD BE PLACED CURBSIDE ON THE 4TH WEDNESDAY OF THE
MONTH

(5) CONTRACTORS: THE NYACK D.P.W. IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR TAKING DEBRIS FROM
CONTRACTOR WORK AREAS.

(6) TRUCK RENTAL: ALL RESIDENTS MAY RENT THE VILLAGE TRUCK FOR MAJOR HOUSE
CLEAN UPS AND OTHER DEBRIS. THE CHARGE \$300 FOR THE FIRST 3 TONS. IF YOU
ARE OVER, YOU WILL BE BILLED. FOR MORE INFORMATION CALL 845-358-3552.

Village of Nyack Department of Public Works

§ 41-1 Collection Hours in Residential Areas

Refuse containers shall be placed on or near the curb before 7:00am on the days specified for collection by the Village in residential areas. Containers may not be placed at the curb earlier than 6:00pm of the night proceeding the scheduled village collection day in the residential area.

§ 41-7 Use of public rubbish containers restricted.

No person shall use the public rubbish containers for disposal of household or commercial refuse.

§ 41-10 Removal of containers after refuse collection.

All refuse containers must be removed from the curb or sidewalk area the day that refuse is collected, except in the Business District as provided in § 41-5, which requires removal of all containers within one hour after collection.

§ 41-22 Penalties for offenses

Any person committing an offense against any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a violation pursuant to the Penal Law of the State of New York, punishable by a fine of not less than \$20 and not exceeding \$250 or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

**Please follow the guidelines below to avoid a delay in the pickup of your materials:
Recycling Service is provided by Miele Sanitation**

- Place bins curbside the night before collection. Bring bins in immediately after collection.
- You may use clear plastic bags if your recycling bins are not big enough. Please place these bags alongside your designated recycling bins.
- Place newspapers, including all inserts, in newspaper **BLUE** bin. Place glass, plastic, and cans (tin, aluminum, bi-metals) in **GREEN** bin. Rinse containers to remove all excess food. Containers should be washed clean and free of lids, caps, etc.
- If your recyclable material is not picked up on the scheduled date, please contact the **Miele Sanitation (201) 768-5407** as soon as possible or Public Works (845) 358-3552
- Corrugated cardboard is also recyclable, and must be cut or folded into manageable bundles and tied.
- Cardboard must be flat and cut to pieces no larger than 3'x3'. Keep corrugated cardboard separate from bins.

DO NOT Place the following in recycling bins; paper bags or plastic bags; light bulbs; china; and porcelain.

Directions to the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), Transfer Station and Composting Facility (CoCo)

From New York State Thruway Northbound (from TZ bridge)

Take exit 15A (Suffern/Sloatsburg)
Off ramp, turn right at overhead traffic light onto Orange Ave (Rte. 59)
Cross over steel bridge
Make first left, onto Torne Valley Road
Proceed approximately 1.6 miles to electric station on left
Turn right at blue and white sign and continue to top of the hill
CoComposting Facility is the first building on the right
Continue on to get to the Materials Recovery Facility and Administration Building
The Administrative offices are on the second floor

From New York State Thruway Southbound (from Albany)

Take exit 15A (Suffern/Sloatsburg)
Make right turn off ramp, and another quick right under Thruway
Cross over steel bridge
Make first left, onto Torne Valley Road
Proceed approximately 1.6 miles to electric station on left
Turn right at blue and white sign and continue to top of the hill
CoComposting Facility is the first building on the right
Continue on to get to the Materials Recovery Facility and Administration Building
The Administrative offices are on the second floor

Directions to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility

Take the Palisades Interstate Parkway to exit 12, go south on Route 45, turn right onto Pomona Road, make first right onto Fireman's Memorial Drive. The Facility is located INSIDE the Fire Training Center on the right hand side.

Directions to the Yardwaste Facility

From the New York State Thruway or Palisades Interstate Parkway, turn onto Route 303.

(Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators)

Small businesses, institutions, and non-profits in Rockland County that qualify for CESQG status may also deliver household hazardous waste to the HHW Facility for a fee. This fee is waived for Rockland municipalities and schools.

Cell Phone Donation Program

Bring us your unwanted cell phones and chargers and Verizon Wireless will donate cell phones or a portion of proceeds from resale to domestic violence groups.

Small Freon-Containing Appliances

Small Freon-containing appliances are accepted at the HHW Facility. For information on disposing larger items, contact your municipality.

Compact Fluorescent Bulbs

You can now bring **CFLs**, Compact Fluorescent Lights, to the HHW Facility for recycling.

All fluorescent bulbs contain mercury, which is highly toxic to people and our environment.

Printer Cartridge Recycling

Bring us your empty ink-jet and laser printer cartridges for recycling. The Rockland County Department of Social Services uses the proceeds to help fund special programs.

SHARPS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT THE HHW FACILITY

SHARPS are needles, syringes and lancets used by residents for self medication.

Chairman's Message

Rockland residents get "Greener" every year! Last year 17,106 customers dropped off over 40,000 gallons of paint sludge; 7,100 gallons of oil; 687,565 pounds of electronic waste; over 20,000 pounds of various types of batteries; 15,475 fluorescent light bulbs – and that's just part of our annual collection total. Can you imagine the harmful effect all these materials would have on the environment if they were sent to a landfill, as they were in the "old days"? Unfortunately, this still happens, as many communities have only a few collection days per year. Rockland County is one of the few in New York State whose residents can drop off HHW *every day of the week* and on targeted weekend days. This convenience and availability is part of our success. In 2004, when we first remained open every day of the week, the number of participants rose dramatically, and has remained high. In these days of economic hardship and concern – it is even more important to reduce, reuse, recycle... and also to "re-buy" products made from recycled materials. These green efforts help save natural resources, reduce our carbon emissions and also reduce prices by reducing the cost of manufacturing. This savings is compounded by the fact that every time we make environmentally responsible purchases or disposal choices, we help avoid pollution. As famous environmental writer and activist of the television series "The Nature of Things", David Suzuki says, "If we want to move towards a low-polluting, sustainable society, we need to get consumers to think about their purchases." Pollution-avoidance is cost-avoidance! Making correct environmental choices is far less expensive than paying for environmental clean-ups. So think smart by thinking green and buying green! Remember to **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**...and always bring your household hazardous waste to the HHW Facility. Together, we'll save money and keep ourselves and our environment healthy and beautiful.

Helpful Hints...

Avoid Toxic Products...

- Use a little “elbow grease”
- Plan for the least toxic product
- Buy only what you need

Safe Storage...

- Keep in a cool, dry place; away from flame, water sources, children and pets
- Do not remove labels
- Label all secondary containers yourself

Safe Use...

- Follow label directions exactly
- Never mix products unless recommended
- Wear protective gear as directed
- Properly ventilate work area

Safe Disposal...

- Never dump waste on the ground
- Never pour waste down your drains

Safe Transportation...

- Secure containers upright in a box
- Place leaking containers inside another sealable container
